

BENCHMARK 1 Target Population

- The ECCHS recruitment and enrollment processes shall Identify, Recruit, and Enroll the subpopulations of:
 - Students <u>At-risk</u>
 - Students who have not passed two or more subjects in the foundation curriculum during a semester in the preceding or current school year,
 - Students who are of limited English proficiency,
 - Students who have failed a state administered assessment.
 - <u>Historically Underrepresented</u> in college courses
 - Coordinate activities with feeder middle school(s), and higher education partner(s)


The ECCHS shall **clearly document** recruitment and enrollment policies and practices, refining and improving them annually based on data reviews.

Stafford Municipal School District Lottery Process

In February 2021, Stafford MSD was awarded the designation by the Texas Education Agency (TEA) to be a provisional Early College High School. Through our partnership with Houston Community College (HCC), Stafford's ECHS <u>has the opportunity to</u> offer students of all demographics and economic status the ability to earn an Associate Degree (60 college credit hours) at no cost to them or their family while attending high school. Our primary goals are to inform, recruit, and enroll students from differentiating backgrounds and economic status and increase their opportunities for post-secondary success.

All Early College program admittance is based on an application process. Students will apply through the "*Apply Texas*" (<u>https://www.applytexas.org/adappc/gen/c_start.WBX</u>) website and submit a district online application. Once the students are validated within the system (usually within 24-48 hours), an email will be sent out to the parents to arrange a meeting to discuss placement and further requirements to maintain enrollment.

Admission Policy

- 1. During 8th grade year, take the PSAT exam
- 2. Submit interest form during 8th grade year
- 3. Email will be received to arrange a meeting to discuss enrollment policies and procedures
- 4. Apply through Apply Texas Website
- 5. Receive HCC ID# (usually within 24 hours)
- 6. Submit HCC Dual Credit Waiver
- 7. Meet with counselor to register for the Associate Degree Program

BENCHMARK 2 PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

Defines the partnership

- School district shall pay for college tuition (for all dual credit courses, including retakes), fees (including TSI administration fees), and required textbooks to the extent those charges are not waived by the partner IHE;
- **Defines an active partnership** between the school district(s) and the IHE(s), which shall include joint decision-making procedures that allow for the planning and implementation of a coherent program across institutions; and
- Data-sharing agreement that promotes <u>collaborative interventions</u> <u>with processes</u> for collecting, sharing, and reviewing program and student data to assess the progress of students served by the ECCHS Design

BENCHMARK 3 P-16 Leadership Initiatives

The Early College and Career High School shall **provide a rigorous course of study** that enables a participating student to receive:

- Receive a high school diploma and complete the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's (THECB) core curriculum (as defined by Title 19 of the Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §4.28),
- Obtain certifications, or
- Earn an Associate Degree, or
- Earn at least 60 credit hours toward a Baccalaureate Degree during grades 9-12.

The ECCHS shall provide students with academic, social, and emotional support in their course of study.

What is Dual Credit?

associate degree or at least 60 college hours towards

Technical Education (CTE) degree while gaining

- . Houston Community College (HCC) provides high school students with the opportunity to earn college credit and high school credit through enrollment with HCC while in high school.
- . Any high school student or homeschooled student who is currently enrolled in 9th grade (eligible starting their spring semester) or higher may be eligible for dual credit. Students demonstrating college readiness through a State of Texas approved college placement test can earn dual credit by taking an approved college class offered at a high school, HCC campus, or online.
- . At little to no cost, students can begin their college careers while still in high school.







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BENCHMARK 5 ACADEMIC RIGOR & READINESS

- The ECCHS shall provide a **TSIA assessment** to accepted students as early as incoming 9th graders (however, not as a prerequisite for admissions to the ECHS).
 - a. The ECCHS shall implement a plan for TSIA success, including academic preparation classes for accepted students, academic interventions for students who do not pass TSI, and assessments fee waivers for all administrations of the TSI test.
 - b. The ECCHS shall publish on their website the dates, time, and location that the TSI will be administered.
 - c. The ECCHS shall review TSI testing data, particularly the number/percentage of students who have currently passed each section of the TSI assessment, to ensure the ECHS is on track to meeting outcomes-based measures.

I. TOTAL # TESTED: 71 / 78

II. MET COLLEGE READINESS STANDARD IN BOTH ELAR / WRITING

a. 14 (20%) Students qualified in both ELAR and the Writer Placer

III. QUALIFIED IN ONE SECTION

- a. 18 (25%) Students qualified in at least one section
 - 7 Qualified in the Writer Placer with two students scoring above a 5
 - 11 Qualified in the ELAR
 - > 10 (14%) Students scored a 940-944, just barely missing the ELAR standard
 - > 21 (30%) Students scored a 4 on the Writer Placer
 - > 4 Students were chosen to be Hand Scored (results pending)

IV. DID NOT MEET COLLEGE READINESS STANDARD

a. 39 (54%) Students did not meet the CR Standard in either section

V. DID NOT TEST

- a. 7 Students were unable to test and will be tested, Tuesday, Nov 9.

BENCHMARK 6 School Design

- The ECCHS location
- ECCHS staff
 - An ECCHS leader who has autonomy for course and instructor scheduling, staff and faculty hiring, and budget development
 - An IHE liaison with decision-making authority who interacts directly and frequently (in-person or virtually) with the ECHS leader and the dual credit provider
 - Highly qualified ECCHS teachers
 - <u>Counseling</u>/Advising staff
- ECCHS shall implement an <u>Annual Professional Development Plan</u> (i.e., calendar of events/activities) for teachers and staff
- ECCHS campuses <u>not located on a college or university campus</u> shall provide students with frequent use of IHE academic and support facilities, such as libraries, labs, advising center, career center, cultural facilities, and sports facilities.
